Online Delivery

The program is completed online and consists of three consecutive courses, each 12 weeks long and 42 hours in length. The content is delivered in weekly modules.

We offer six one-hour virtual classroom meetings per course for networking, discussions, and extra support.

Course Fees

Courses are taken one at a time in order.

You must apply to the program before you can register for the first course VOLM1101.

There is a \$35 fee to apply to the program.

The approximate cost per courses is \$325.

Individuals receive professional information, resources, tools, and templates to develop a strong volunteer engagement program.

We use a unique portfolio approach that allows you to create a program from scratch or enhance an existing volunteer program.

Instead of tests or research papers, you will develop policies and procedures, position descriptions, risk assessment tools, volunteer applications, marketing and recruitment plans, structured interviews, orientation sessions, supervision and support strategies, recognition events, strategic plans, and program evaluation tools.

Who is the Program For?

The program is ideal for anyone seeking a career change or working with volunteers in social services, recreation and sports, libraries, arts and culture, hospitals, long-term care, health care, municipalities, educational settings, or faith-based organizations.

The skills are highly transferable for supervisory or leadership roles.

You do not need to be a Volunteer Manager/Coordinator to take this course - only an interest in working with and learning to support volunteers.
